The Cam Neely Foundation Announces Two New Executive Appointments

December 4, 2018-- (BOSTON, MA) – The Cam Neely Foundation, a non-profit organization that provides comfort, support and hope to cancer patients and their families, today announced the appointment of two key executives that will join their leadership team. David Tubbs was selected as the Executive Director and Andrew Osofsky was selected as Manager of Special Events and Development.

Tubbs brings to the position an extensive background in fundraising in Boston in higher education and healthcare, as well as an innate ability to create and maintain strong prospect and donor relationships and achieve significant results through positive influence. Previously Tubbs spent more than 19 years at Massachusetts General Hospital raising philanthropic support for areas such as global health, immunology research, pediatrics, stem cell research, basic science research as well as playing a leadership role within the Development Office in the hospital's \$1.5B Campaign for the Third Century of Medicine completed in December 2013. During this Campaign, Tubbs raised the largest gift (\$100M) in the more than 200 year history of Massachusetts General Hospital. Tubbs began his role with the foundation in TK month 2018. In his position he will be responsible for the organization's strategic and operational planning, fundraising, marketing, and execution of its mission to provide comfort, support and hope to cancer patients and their families.

David Tubbs stated, "I am beyond thrilled to be able to work with Paulina and Cam Neely to build on the Foundation's incredibly successful fundraising efforts over the past more than two decades raising philanthropic support for Tufts Medical Center in Boston."

Andrew (Andy) Osofsky joined The Cam Neely Foundation when it was established in 1995 and remained on the Foundation's staff until 2009. During that period of time, he was responsible for planning and executing the Foundation's fundraising events, oversaw the day to day operations of the organization, and also served as a frontline fundraiser. In total, Andy was responsible for helping to raise more than \$15 million for the Foundation. He recently returned to the Foundation in July of 2018 as Manager of Special Events and Development. Osofsky will be responsible for planning and executing all fundraising events as well as creating new development strategies and communications that are consistent with the Foundation's mission. He will also participate in establishing a plan to strengthen and enhance the organization's ability to raise additional revenues from donors and sponsors.

Cam Neely stated, "This is an exciting period of growth for The Cam Neely Foundation as we explore new avenues of growth to increase the reach and impact of services to provide comfort, support and hope to cancer patients and their families. We are thrilled to have secured the depth of experience and background that David brings to the nonprofit sector and look forward to having Andy back with the Foundation in this new capacity."
